## Using possessive endings correctly

- Add an apostrophe with s (–'s) to the possessive forms of singular count and non-count nouns.
  - o Example: The mayoral candidate expressed her opposition to the **government's** decision to raise taxes.
- Add an apostrophe alone to the possessive forms of plural nouns that end in -s.
  - Example: The board members are still debating the issue. The **board members'** decision will be made public next week.
- Add -'s to the possessive forms of irregular plural nouns that do not end in -s.
  - Example: Public opinion polls indicate people's feelings about important political issues.
- Note that the possessive form of the pronoun it is its not it's.
  - o Example: At the convention, the party introduced its candidate for the presidency.
