Using parallel structures in sentences

- Use parallel structures (the same type of words) whenever you write a list or comparison.
 - Incorrect (and confusing): The proposal will provide several benefits, including creating jobs, crimes will be prevented, and reducing taxes.
 - Corrected (all the items in the list start with nouns ending in -ing): The
 proposal will provide several benefits, including creating jobs, preventing
 crime, and reducing taxes.
- To create parallel structures, use the same grammatical forms (e.g., adjectives, nouns
 with -ing endings, prepositional phrases, clauses) in a list or comparison.
 - Example (four adjectives):
 The proposed law is not only unfair and unpopular, but also unnecessary and dangerous.
 - Example (three phrases with a noun with an -ing ending):
 Eating fruits and vegetables, exercising daily and getting enough sleep are some of the things each of us can do to maintain a healthy lifestyle.
 - Example (two prepositional phrases that are followed by a clause):
 For students, flexible working hours are helpful; however, for parents, a steady job is more important.
